Dear partners in Christ's ministry,

If you were here for worship on the Sunday of Memorial Day weekend, you heard me preach a call-to-action sermon where I said that we can no longer afford to "go to church," but instead we must become more intentional about **being the church** out in the world. I also pointed to the results of the research our synod leaders have done with congregations throughout our state over the past year. The analysis of the surveys and interviews shows our congregations need to be more intentional about reaching out and partnering with our neighbors in the wider community for the sake of the gospel. It's imperative that we act NOW, because if we **don't** act, in the next five to seven years about 40% of our congregations will

be in crisis mode, fighting for survival. This is sobering news, because we surely don't want to face the prospect that this could happen to **us!**... And yet it's also **hopeful news**. It's hopeful because when we recognize and name the elephant in the room, then we can begin to address the problem in constructive ways. Mostly, though, it's hopeful news because **we are the church**, and the church **belongs to Christ. Forever**. As Paul wrote to the church in Rome, "[Y]ou did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption...." In the waters of baptism, you and I were claimed as beloved children of God, and we've been set free to bear witness to the gospel—NOT here inside the four walls of our church building, but **out there in the world**, where many are hungry to know Christ and the life that is in him. Like the first Christians in the book of Acts, we may not always get it right, and that's okay, because God is with us to lift us up when we stumble, and if we're faithful in persevering, in due time God **will** bless the seeds of our work and bring forth an abundant harvest. Our God will do this, because God wants you and me to **help write the sequel to the book of Acts** in our time and place!

Some of you may be wondering: How did we get here? How did we get to the point where so many of our congregations are sliding down the slippery slope toward extinction?... Think about this: If Jesus' first disciples hadn't left the temple and their synagogues and gone out into the streets to relay the Good News of the gospel throughout the generations, you and I wouldn't be followers of Christ today. After all, how can people come to know the God revealed through Jesus Christ, if his disciples don't tell anyone?!... And yet the truth is that for a long time now, most members of Christ's church in Europe and North America haven't done a very good job of proclaiming the gospel out in the world. Some of our reluctance is rooted in fear and embarrassment: We don't know how to talk about our faith, because we weren't taught how. We were taught to be polite and not be pushy about such private matters.... So, we sat in our church buildings and waited for people to come to us. Many of us are **still** sitting here in our church building, asking: "Why aren't people coming? We have something good here. Don't they know that they need what we have?..." NO! Of course they don't know, because **we haven't told them!** How would they know, when we've kept it a well-wrapped, internal secret all



these years? Blinded by the insights of the Enlightenment, it seems we've largely lost sight of God's greater vision for our lives and for our world. To say it another way, we've lost sight of the purpose of the church, which is to continue Christ's work of bringing healing and good news out into the world, where many are hungry to know they are loved.

I raise this with you because this is the pivotal issue Zoar Lutheran Church and many other congregations are facing right now: If we don't learn to get outside our own doors and make life-giving connections with our neighbors, our congregations will dwindle and die, and none of us wants to see that happen.... The things I've witnessed in recent years have convinced me that the Holy Spirit is shaking up the church, plucking up dead wood and pulling down the walls that have kept us insulated for too long.... Just as the Spirit long ago called Jesus' original disciples out from behind closed doors, so the Spirit is calling you and me out of our comfort zones today. Since this is new territory for most of us, our first steps will probably feel tentative and scary. Like a toddler learning to walk, we'll undoubtedly stumble and fall, but if we can hang onto the promise that God is with us in the midst of this wobbly, messy, holy work, bit by bit we'll begin to see growth and new life springing forth.

I honestly don't know what the path forward will look like, but I do know that it will require two things from all of us: a lot of prayer and mutual discernment. I also know that mission plans don't unfold like "business plans," because the church isn't

a "business!" The church is the people of God, who are called to be active participants in God's mission to love and bless the world.... Mission plans tend to unfold more organically: To be sure, there is intentional hard work involved in planting and watering the seeds of the gospel, but since God's in charge of the growth, "measurable results" are often hidden for a long time. (Consider the fact that many of the teaching parables Jesus tells have to do with planting and harvesting!)

During the summer months, I'll be conferring with Zoar's council leadership around the goal of setting up a "listening season" in the fall. A listening season is a time of small group conversations about matters that are important to the life of the community. It's an opportunity for **everyone's** voice to be heard. To help us prepare for this time of holy conversation, the Sunday morning adult class will begin a study of *Unbinding the Gospel* (schedule TBA), which focuses on the power of prayer in revitalizing congregational mission and ministry. In addition, members of our Stewardship Team and of the church council will begin to lead us bit by bit into a more holistic evaluation of our gifts and vision for ministry.

I ask all of you, the people of God here at Zoar Lutheran Church, to keep these changes and challenges in mind and to hold the whole congregation in prayer as we move into the future God is preparing for us. As you pray and discern Zoar's part in God's ongoing mission to the world, you may find that you need to let go of some old expectations and paradigms for pastoral ministry, so that your pastor can devote more time to forging partnerships in the

wider community for the sake of the gospel. As members of this congregation, you also must be willing to embrace the changes that lie ahead.... In fact, since the word "embrace" implies a measure of control, it's probably more accurate to say: You must be willing to **surrender yourselves** to the changes that lie ahead. After all, it's God who's in control.... and although it may not always feel like it in the moment, ultimately that's **Good News** for all of us! To say it another way: Even though you and I may not know what the future holds, we **do** know the One who holds our future, and so we know we're in good hands!

From what I've seen in my almost-seven months at Zoar, this congregation has the resources to surf the waves of change that lie ahead. God has blessed you with many gifts, and even though you may not always see yourselves that way, you are rich in time, talent, and treasure! You **are** also rich in spiritual depth and hunger for God's Word, and you have a core group of caring, committed leaders who are willing to take the time to listen and discern God's call.

In the days ahead, I encourage you to keep your eyes and ears open. Good things are stirring here at Zoar, as we welcome new members and visitors, as we study God's Word and share our stories and deepen relationships with each other, and as we go out into the community to connect with our neighbors. I have no doubt that God has great things in store for the people of God here at Zoar Lutheran Church!

PROJECT START RIGHT






