“The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”—John 3:8

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.—Genesis 1:1-2

Dear partners in Christ’s ministry,

Last night I lay awake for a long time listening to the wind. For the most part, I enjoy drifting off to the sound of rustling leaves and the musical tones our wind chimes make when the breeze lifts them. But last night’s wind was stronger than usual, and it kept me awake...or maybe it’s more accurate to say that the wind added to the things that kept me awake. (I don’t think I’m alone in noticing that nighttime seems to be the “right time” for pondering and worrying about things we’re too busy to tackle during the daytime!)



Anyway, as I lay there not sleeping, part of a verse from John’s gospel sprang to mind, “The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of

it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes...” I thought about the wind blowing freely wherever it chooses, touching whoever and whatever it chooses, in whatever way it chooses: as a gentle breeze that caresses the tops of towering trees or as a violent wind that propels the flames of raging wildfires. Then I thought about the context of the Bible verse itself, which consists of words Jesus speaks to Nicodemus, a seeker who comes to him under cover of darkness. Here, as elsewhere in Scripture, it’s the context that provides the meaning! The second half of this verse helps us begin to understand what Jesus is trying to teach Nicodemus: namely, that in order to be “born of the Spirit” one must be open to receiving the Spirit wherever and whenever it shows up!

Of course, being a preacher, my mind then segued back to a quote I shared in the sermon for Reformation Sunday: “The Holy Spirit works faith when and where it pleases God in those who hear the gospel...” (Article V, The Augsburg Confession) I thought about Zoar’s first Listening Season 2.0, where thirty of us gathered after worship to share the laments and hopes of our hearts, to ponder some of the pressures facing our neighbors, and to name some of the places we see the Spirit of God at work in the community outside our church doors. I’m grateful for this time of holy conversation, and I hope that it’s only the first of many we’ll have at

Zoar, as we seek to discern how God is calling us to partner with what God is already doing out there in the world, as well as inside our church building, to realize God’s dream of shalom. I’m grateful for this first step, even as I realize that we don’t have a clue where exactly this journey will take us! All we know for sure is that just like the wind, “the Spirit blows where it chooses”; indeed, it’s worth noting that in both biblical languages, Hebrew and Greek, “wind” and “spirit” are the very same word!...¹

Somewhere along the way during my nocturnal mind travels, I did manage to drift off to sleep. I know this because I awoke this morning thinking about another Bible verse: the one from Genesis, which speaks of how the ru’ah—that is, the wind or spirit—was present at the very beginning, caressing the chaos and propelling God’s good creation into being.... I share this with you, my sisters and brothers, because it seems a timely reminder that as we move into uncharted territory, we can do so knowing that the Spirit is already there and will continue to be there with us, working when and where and however God pleases to shape our uncertain chaos into God’s unfolding promise of shalom for the whole world.

¹ The Hebrew word *ru’ah* can mean either wind or spirit, and the same is true of the Greek word *pneuma*.



Hope for the Holidays

The holidays should be a magical, wondrous time for children.

But this year in America, hundreds of children and families will be spending the holiday behind bars — because they crossed the United States border seeking protection. There are two ways you may help these children & families.

1. **Make a donation.** With your donations, LIRS will purchase gifts for children of all ages and deliver them in time to be opened on Christmas morning. Donations may be made along with your regular offering (designated for **Hope for the Holidays**). Thank you for helping us provide Hope For the Holidays to the kids we serve.

2 **Write & decorate a card.** You can bring joy and hope to families in immigration detention, and to children who crossed our borders alone, by writing and decorating holiday cards in English and Spanish. Following are sample greetings in both English and Spanish. Draw a picture or share your favorite poem, quote, or Bible verse to personalize the card. Sign the card (first name and city/state). Do not put the cards in an envelope. Bring the cards to the church by **December 1**.

English message:

Dear friend,

Please know that you are not alone or forgotten. I am praying for you and your family. I am also fighting for justice for you and your family, and for all our brothers and sisters who leave their countries in search of a better life.

Never forget that we are praying and fighting for you and your family.

God's blessings and peace at Christmas and for the New Year.

Purchase plants as a gift for family or friends, for your home, or to help decorate the church for the Christmas season. In doing so, you will be helping to support preschool scholarships.




